





WHY BUILDING RDM COMMUNITIES?

- There isn't a unique authority on this subject.
- > Knowledge, services and expertise are distributed and offered in a fragmented manner, both internally and externally:
 - Internally at the VU: Library, IT, Grants Office, Legal Dpt., IXA (Knowledge Transfer Office), Faculties.
 - Externally: SURF, DANS, EOSC, NWO, ZonMw, etc.


ESTABLISHING COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE


