DCMI definition	A language of the intellectual content of the resource.
Usage	Recommended
Usage instruction	<p>A specific resource (an instance of scientific output) is either written in one human language or more. In these cases all used languages are used in the DC element 'language'. If a specific resource (an instance of scientific output) is written in one human language and is translated into other human languages, each translation does have its own record.. Recommended: ISO 639-x, where x can be 1,2 or 3.</p> <p>Best Practice: we use ISO 639-3 and by doing so we follow: [http://www.sil.org/ISO639-3/codes.asp]</p> <p>If necessary, repeat this element to indicate multiple languages.</p> <p>If ISO 639-2 and 639-1 are sufficient for the contents of a repository they can be used alternatively. Since there is a unique mapping this can be done during an aggregation process.</p>
